ABOUT VENUE

The Central Association of Hungarian Iron and Metal Workers' headquarters (Vasas Szakszervezeti Szövetség), often called the "church of the iron workers," stands as a testament to Hungary's construction and industrial prowess of the late 1920s. Completed in 1928, this building was designed by Béla Tauszig and Zsigmond Róth to be both practical and symbolic of the workers' movement. Every element, from bricks to iron beams, was sourced domestically, showcasing the dedication to Hungarian craftsmanship. It includes features like the Art Deco entrance, spacious meeting halls, and rooms for union activities. Its main hall, adorned with Ferenc Kopp's stained-glass windows and bronze chandeliers, was a venue for cultural events and gatherings, resonating with workers' ideals. This headquarters reflects an era of pride and resilience for Hungarian laborers, representing their collective strength and aspirations.

Over time, the headquarters at 5-7 Magdolna Street became more than just an office space; it gained a storied history entwined with Hungary's political shifts. During WWII, it was repurposed by the Arrow Cross for counter-espionage activities, and later, in 1949, the infamous Rajk trial was held here, drawing international attention and symbolizing both the strength and the struggles of the Hungarian working class. Today, the building hosts events, including graduations and film shoots, keeping its legacy alive. Although its exterior may show signs of wear, inside, the vibrant hallways and historic banquet hall, once alive with heated debates and celebrations, stand as lasting symbols of Hungary's industrial heritage and the enduring spirit of its ironworkers.
